PRE-REQUISITES

- In order to be eligible to take the program in February, students must be successfully completing their high school graduation requirements at the end of 1st semester in January
- Registered & attending a public school in Surrey
- Excellent attendance and punctuality
- English 12 with C+ or better; excellent written communication skills
- Strong math skills recommended Foundations or Pre-Calculus Math
- Volunteer work with children recommended
- Once conditional acceptance is granted a Police Information Check must be completed prior to official acceptance

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- Have a discussion with your Career Facilitator, counsellor and parent/guardian to ensure the program meets your goals
- Obtain a district partnership application package from your Career Centre
- Learn how to get to Surrey Community College and where it is located at REC or Invergarry
- Submit a completed application package with all supporting documents to your Career Facilitator before the specified due date
- If short-listed, attend an interview with the District Career Coordinator
- Note: Proof of Police Information Check (PIC) prior to official acceptance

SELECTION PROCESS

- Students who submit a completed application will have a preliminary interview with their Career Facilitator
- Applications are forwarded to the district office and only short-listed candidates will be interviewed for a potential seat in the program
- Students must be able to meet the physical demands of the program
- Students must meet all criteria, be selfmotivated, independent learners and capable of success in the program

JOB DESCRIPTION

Education Assistants (EAs) work with teachers to support students with diverse learning challenges, and special needs. The supports they provide include behaviour management, curriculum implementation, social skills development, personal care and physical assistance.

EAs may work with a school-based team including teachers, parents, and medical professionals to support a student's physical, emotional, and learning needs. They also help to implement individualized education plans (IEPs) designed to help students thrive in the classroom.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Education Assistant Diploma Program is designed to provide knowledge and skills for education assistants to work with children and adolescents who require assistance in the learning process. Topics will include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Roles and responsibilities
- Knowledge and application of appropriate strategies, techniques and materials for individualized instructional support
- Behavioural support
- Personal care and/or health-related support
- Knowledge and skills in technology
- Ethical and professional standards of conduct
