Frequently asked questions

You have questions, we have answers. Here's what you've been asking us lately:

Will conditional offers be revoked due to midterm results?

No — final results will be reviewed once received to determine if a student has met the conditions in their offer letter.

Does TMU calculate the subject prerequisites in the overall average?

Not necessarily, as we calculate averages based on the top results. An example scenario: calculating the average of the top six Grade 12 U/M courses for a high school student in Ontario. If results in subject prerequisites aren't in the top six, these marks won't be included in the average calculation.

How can a student apply for a summer school extension?

The <u>summer school extension form</u> will be available in mid-May on our website.

Which programs are still accepting applications?

We regularly update <u>programs accepting applications</u>. Students may not be familiar with some unique TMU programs like:

- <u>Child and Youth Care</u>, a professional program that teaches students to design and implement developmental, preventative and therapeutic programs for youth, as well as advocate for youth.
- Arts and Contemporary Studies, a humanities program with a flexible curriculum and a variety of global opportunities.

Business student leads Indigenous economic resurgence projects
For third-year <u>Business Management student Cody Anthony</u>, working towards First Nation economic growth is both a vital aspect of reconciliation between Canada and Indigenous peoples, and a practical route to self-reliance and self-determination.

Anthony, an Urban-Indigenous (Dene:Settler) youth whose family originates from the Northwest Territories, is the founder of the Ted Rogers Indigenous in Business community-centred student organization. The group works to increase representation of Indigenous peoples in the economic sector and Indigenous values within economic development strategies.

TMU awarded \$98.6 million in funding to support transformational migrant integration research

TMU will lead an <u>innovative new research program</u> to further understanding of migrant integration during a time of rapid technological transformation. This collaborative, pan-Canadian effort will be supported for seven years by a \$98.6 million grant from the Canada First Research Excellence Fund (CFREF).
